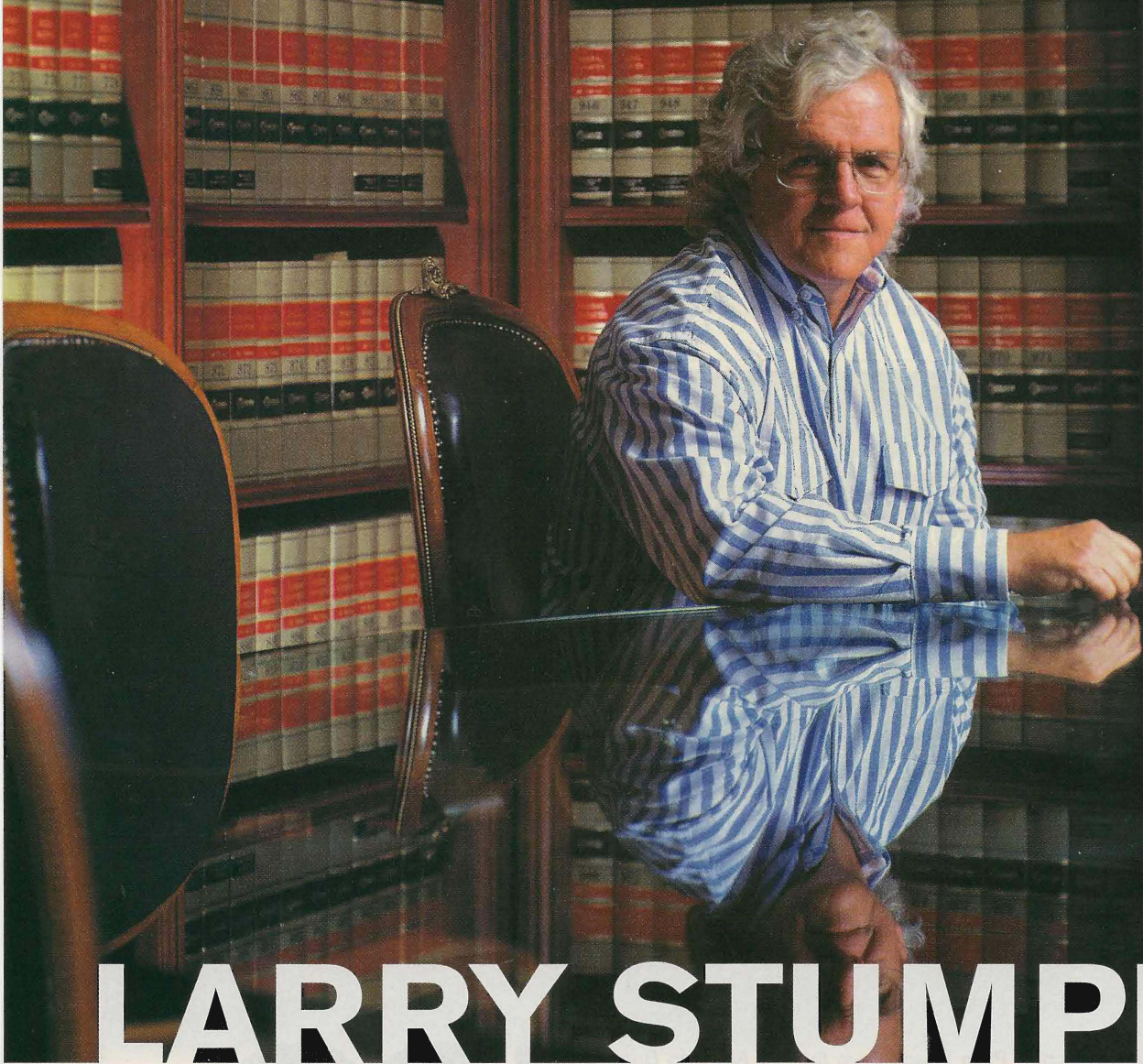


## IN PLAY

**THE PLAYER:** Veteran trial lawyer Larry Stumpf, 55. **LATEST PLAY:** Left law firm Akerman Senterfitt to become a name partner in Black, Srebnick & Kornspan, the firm of high-profile criminal defense lawyer Roy Black. Stumpf will handle civil litigation at the new firm. **BACKGROUND:** Civil trial lawyer for 20 years in South Florida, focuses on what he calls "fight-of-their-life" type cases. Lives on a small horse farm in Davie, where he keeps 10 horses and rides daily. Once argued a case before the US Supreme Court in cowboy boots. Recent clients include Access Resource Services, Inc. (the company which used "Miss Cleo" as a spokesperson) in a law suit brought by the Federal Trade Commission; singer Enrique Iglesias in a contract dispute; California financier Calvin Grigsby in a dispute with Miami-Dade County over the Port of Miami's crane operations. Prior to heading Akerman's Miami litigation practice, was with law firm Bilzin, Sumberg, Dunn, Baena, Price & Axelrod.
