

CLEARED IN A TAX EVASION CASE, HELIO CASTRONEVES HAS PUT THE ACCELERATOR DOWN ON BUSINESS DEALS AND HIS RETURN AS AN INDYCAR FAN FAVORITE.

Helio Castroneves had a pretty full dance card this year

Just in the past six months, he won his third Indy 500, met the president of his native Brazil, drove an Aston Martin and a Ferrari for a feature in *Maxim* magazine and served as grand marshal of the Coconut Grove bed race.

He walked the orange carpet at the Dolphins' home opener last month, filmed ads for healthcare company HCA and became a spokesman for luxury car club GentlemenDrive Miami.

And oh yeah, in April he was acquitted of federal tax evasion charges after a seven-week trial in Miami. A conviction could have sent him to prison for more than six years.

While the 34-year-old IndyCar Series driver won't be able to capture the IndyCar Series championship at the season finale at Homestead-Miami Speedway on Saturday, the Season 5 winner of Dancing with the Stars is all the way back—even though it's as if he never really went away.
